The 2013 Scandinavian Festival is set for Memorial Day weekend, May 25-27.

The festival begins with a special event Thursday evening at 7 p.m. when we will hear from **Elder Russell M. Nelson**, a member of the Quorum of the Twelve Apostles of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He will be speaking at the YSA 1st Stake Center. Additional conference speakers are scheduled for Friday morning at Snow College.

From Friday noon through Saturday at dusk, the festival grounds at Snow College and Pioneer Park, 50 N 100 W, will buzz with costumes, dancing, storytelling, entertainment, historical tours, craft and food booths, and more.

The Little Scandinavian Dinner will be served 6 p.m. Friday at the Greenwood Student Center. The cost is \$12 for adults and \$7 for children 8 and younger.

The Youth City Council once again promote Saturday's Fun Run. Color stations have been added this year by the USA Freedom Run, so be prepared for a colorful experience! Join us for a walk, a 5K, a 10K, or a half marathon for the die-hards. Categories include individual, fami-

ly, beginning and intermediate.

The 10K and half marathon will begin at 6:30 a.m. and the 5K and walk will begin at 7:00. There will be live music at the end of the runs; it promises to be an exciting event.

New this year is the "Viking on a Bike" which will begin at noon on Saturday right after the parade.

Registration for all races, including the bike ride will be Saturday morning behind the Co-op at 6:00 a.m. Or you can pre-register online at ephraimcity.org by clicking on the Athletics Registration link and scrolling to the bottom.

The festival concludes at the Eccles Center with the BYU International Folk Dancers. This performance will be at 7:00 p.m. and will be an enjoyable experience for all ages. MOSQUITO ABATEMENT TIPS FOR HOMEOWNERS



NOTHING takes the fun out of an evening BBQ like a bunch of pesky mosquitos. Here

are some things homeowners can do to minimize mosquitos.

Since mosquitos lay eggs in stagnant or slow-moving water, walk your property frequently to check for standing water. Areas that collect water but may be overlooked include clogged gutters, garbage containers, aluminum cans and old tires. Every two days, change the water in bird baths, wading pools, pottery, pet dishes, etc. Mosquitos rest during the day on vegetation. Make your yard less hospitable to mosquitoes by mowing regularly, and keeping weeds down.

EPA-approved insecticides registered as effective against adult and larval mosquitoes may also be used. A light application around foundations, shrubs, and grasses will keep adults from resting in these areas. If you spray, remember to keep people and pets out of your yard for a reasonable amount of time as instructed on the package, as the chemicals can be harmful.
