## MAIN STREET BEAUTIFICATION

Over the last couple of years Ephraim City has been working on the design and financing for a Main Street Improvement Project that would revitalize Main Street from 100 North to 100 South.

The City was able to secure a grant through UDOT and plans for construction were to start this fall; however, due to unforeseen issues that arose during the process, that project has been pushed back to commence in spring of 2014. We look forward to this improvement and ask for patience during construction.

The project will include new sidewalks, new lights, stamped con-

crete, benches, a drinking fountain, clock, new trees, planter boxes, and an improved entrance to Pioneer Park.
