NEW TREES FOR MAIN STREET



Ephraim City will be purchasing new trees that will line Main Street between 100 North and 100 South.

The current trees were planted too shallow and the root systems have caused extensive sidewalk damage.

These trees will be pulled out to make room for beautiful Flowering Pear trees.

The new trees will be planted between buried retaining walls with a watering drip system designed to drive the roots deep into the ground to prevent damage to the new sidewalks.
