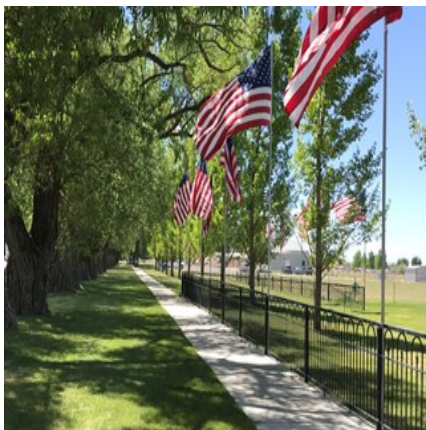

2019 Municipal Election

Three 4-year City Council positions are open for election. Persons seeking to become a candidate for municipal office in Ephraim City shall file a Declaration of Candidacy, along with a \$25 filing fee, in person with the City Recorder during regular office hours (Mon – Fri 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.) in the Ephraim City offices, 5 South Main, **between June 3 and June 7, 2019**. You may either click on “Fillable Burn Permit Form” and submit directly online, or you can click on “Ephraim Burn Permit Application”, print it out, and return the signed form to the Ephraim City offices. It will be sent directly to the Fire Chief at that point.
