Ephraim's Historic Peace Tree

In 1868, a peace treaty was arranged by Canute Peterson and Chief Black Hawk along with five other important chiefs, under the peace tree. They agreed that they would not fight as long as water continued to run in the creek behind the tree.

The "Peace Tree" still stands in the Pioneer Park as a memorial to this historic event. Unfortunately, the tree died several years ago; due to its age and severe deterioration, it has become a danger to those enjoying the park.

With this re-evaluation of the future of the Peace Tree, the City will be posting a survey asking your opinion as to the best way to preserve the memorial, while making it safer for the community.

Ephraim Power

Ever wonder where your power comes from?

Ephraim is a member of the Utah Association of Municipal Power Systems (UAMPS) and is involved in 11 different projects through UAMPS: 1) Hunter Power Plant, located in Emery County. 2) Colorado River Storage Project (CRSP) which is hydro production. 3) Firm Power Supply manages various power supplies for participating members. 4) Horse Butte Wind, located 16 miles east of the city of Idaho Falls and is a supply of renewable energy. 5) Craig Mona, involves transmission line capability to supply the power needed from these various projects. 6) Payson Project, Nebo Power Station gas-fired facility in Payson. 7) Ephraim City pays a transmission fee through UAMPS to Rocky Mountain Power to wheel the power from various substation switchyards and transmission lines throughout central Utah.
